Beating heart bypass facilitates fast recovery in dialysis patient

MANGALURU -- A beating heart bypass surgery was performed on a 55-year-old male at Indiana Hospital and Heart Institute, Mangaluru using a technique of beating heart bypass. A 55-year old male, who was a known chronic kidney disease patient for which he was on dialysis for the past 10 months, was found to have multiple blocks in the heart on evaluation for breathlessness.



He underwent beating heart bypass successfully and was shifted to the ward in just 2 days. BP fluctuations are well known in dialysis patients due to fluid shifts. Beating heart bypass in such cases are challenging due to this. Because of the excellent surgical team and ICU care the patient recovered fast. The patient was discharged in the fourth week of August. Dr. Shyam Krishna Ashok, Senior Consultant Cardiovascular Thoracic Surgeon, Indiana Hospital and Heart Institute, Mangaluru explains about the Beating Heart Bypass.



Beating heart coronary artery bypass surgery or bypass grafting, popularly known as CABG, is the commonest surgery done in the world for heart disease. It is done when the three major coronary arteries (which supply blood to the heart) or its major branches are having significant blocks thereby reducing blood flow to the heart. By this surgery, alternate pathways are created for the blood to flow to the heart using either veins from the legs or arteries from the chest or forearm. There are two ways of doing bypass surgery -1. By use of heart lung machine where the function of the heart and lungs is taken over by a machine, during which time the heart is stopped and the surgery is done and then the heart is re-started. 2. In this, popularly known as Beating heart bypass, the alternate pathways to bypass the blocks are created without stopping the heart. This is done with the help of a device called Octopus (which is a tissue stabiliser) which is used to stabilise the portion of the heart where bypass is done.

Advantages: 1. Fast recovery - Patient is removed from the ventilator within few hours and is shifted to ward in just 2 days and is discharged on the 5th day.

2. Relief of symptoms - Agonizing complaints like chest pain, shortness of breath, etc disappear completely and they can return to active work in 2 or 3 weeks.

3. Medicines - post surgery only 2 or 3 medicines are required and therefore the cost of consuming large number of medicines for symptoms are reduced.


Flozins are a game changer

The field of Clinical Nephrology was starting to get a little repetitive. At the most, we had ACE inhibitors /ARBs to retard disease progression in the majority of our CKD patients. SGLT2 inhibitors approved by FDA in March 2013 has since been a game changer. Nephrologists finally have something new to cheer about! Multiple RCTs of flozins in diabetics have proven their efficacy in retarding major renal and cardiac endpoints. EMPA-KIDNEY (Harrington et al, NEJM 2022) with Empagliflozin 10 mg vs placebo in adult patients at risk of progressive CKD had more than half of the patients who were non diabetics. Over one third of the patients had eGFR<30 and around 50% of the patients had urine ACR < 300 mg/g. IgA nephropathy was present in 817 out of 6609 patients. Composite outcome of cardiovascular death and kidney disease progression was significantly lower in empagliflozin group of proteinuric CKD patients. Even the subgroup of patients with low or no proteinuria had slowing of eGFR loss, however this outcome needs to be studied further.

ESRD. STOP-ACEi trial (Bhandari et al. NEJM 2022) conducted on 411 patients studied the effect of ARB or ACEi in CKD G4-5. It showed no benefit of stopping ACEi /ARBs in advanced CKD. There was no statistical significance in terms of the most feared side effect of hyperkalemia, nor did continuation of these drugs worsen eGFR to culminate to dialysis dependence. In fact discontinuation of the drug was associated with higher CV events and higher need for renal replacement therapy.

Xenotransplantation

Recently published research letter in JAMA Surgery celebrated the normal graft function after pig-to-human kidney xenotransplant. 10-gene-edited pig kidney (UKid-ney) was transplanted to a brain dead male recipient in his 50s, who had acute kidney injury on CKD. Complement inhibitor eculizumab was given 24 hours prior to this cross-match compatible transplant. Standard induction therapy was given with ATG,

Rituximab and solumedrol. Maintenance consisted of MMF, Tacrolimus and prednisone. More than 37 litres of urine was produced in the first 24 hours. Serum creatinine decreased to 1.9 mg/dL within the first 24 hours and was 1.1mg/dL at 48 hours. Creatinine remained normal at POD 7 and serial biopsy showed normal histology. Thus xeno-transplantation seems like a viable option considering the organ shortage crisis that exists today.

Sodium bicarbonate and its effect on BP targets in CKD

A recent systematic review and meta-analysis (CJASN, April 2023) suggested that sodium bicarbonate did not influence systolic BP in individuals with CKD G1-5. There was no increase in need for diuretics in patients on sodium bicarbonate and in fact there was greater decrease in anti hypertensive medication use in these patients. Research suggests that sodium salts have varying effects on BP depending on their anion base-sodium chloride worsens BP whereas sodium bicarbonate may improve BP. Thus, clinical hesitation for sodium bicarbonate use in CKD can be put to rest. For now.
